

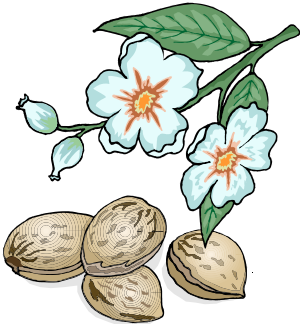

UCCE to Hire Local IPM Advisor – Job Opportunity. The University of California is seeking a Cooperative Extension advisor to conduct a multi-county extension, education and applied research program in integrated pest management, with an emphasis in entomology. Working with UCCE advisors in Stanislaus, Merced and San Joaquin counties, the IPM advisor will provide leadership in promoting IPM through research, training and extension activities. Based in the Stanislaus County UC Cooperative Extension office, the IPM advisor will be a strong link between field issues, local UCCE advisors and campus resources in matters related to IPM, particularly in the area of entomology and weed science.
