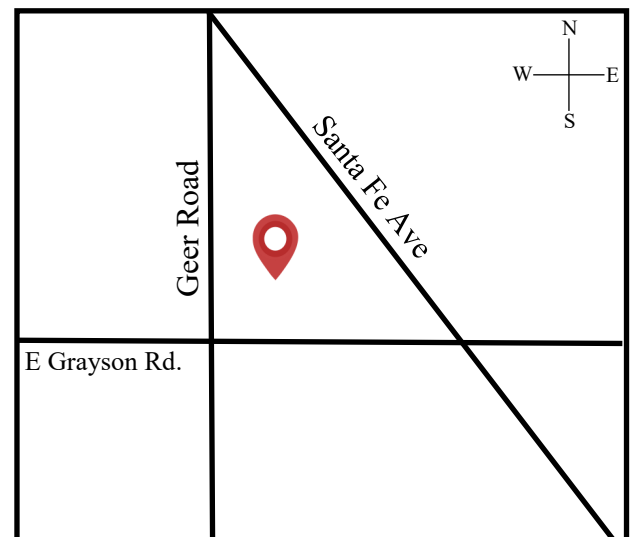

The late season Watermelon Grafting Field Day continues from our June event. Our field trial, kindly supported by Dan Avila & Sons, tests the effects of plant population and various grafted combinations on the watermelon harvest cost, yield and quality.
